Elements of progress is a 500+ page corporate history written to commemorate Rio Tinto's first 150 years in operation. The book was created to inform and inspire current and future employees and customers and to ensure the company's story is documented for posterity.

Over the past 150 years Rio Tinto has played a significant role in driving economic and social progress around the world and, though there is much to be proud of, the company has faced many challenges and made mistakes. This book is an honest attempt to address the company's successes and failures and examine the defining moments that have made Rio Tinto the company it is today. The book is the first of its kind to tell the company's story from its founding in Spain in 1873 and through its global expansion, capturing how it has transformed industries, built cities and influenced the lives of people around the world.

The stories of the many companies that came together to create Rio Tinto have been brought to life with beautiful full-scale imagery, including never-before-seen colourised photography. Scattered throughout the book are a series of short stories, enabling time-poor readers the opportunity to dive in and out of the book and uncover some of its most surprising moment.
