a. Briefly describe the nominated non-profit organization's history and past performance (up to 200 words). Required

Dementia Australia is a leader in harnessing the power of gaming technologies, VR, Al and other high-tech tools to transform dementia education, understanding and care.

Since beginning its audacious tech journey in 2011, Dementia Australia has developed a range of world-leading, tech-driven tools which have made a profound difference in the lives of people impacted by dementia. From BrainyApp, a world-first app with tips and games to reduce the risk of dementia that was downloaded more than 400,000 times, the world's first dementia experience using VR, Talk with Ted, an AI powered online simulation to support respectful communication with people living with dementia and the latest release, D-Esc a VR training tool for a behavioural emergency, designed for participants working in health care, caring for people living with dementia.

Dementia Australia's innovations have attracted national and global acclaim and media coverage and garnered multiple national and international awards.

Our successes have inspired governments to invest and philanthropists and care providers to further support our work.

Through harnessing technology and dreaming big, we are improving the lives of people living with dementia, making a profound and lasting difference to their experience and everyone who is impacted by dementia.

b. Outline the nominated non-profit organization's achievements since the beginning of 2022 that you wish to bring to the judges' attention (up to 250 words). Required

In 2024, it is estimated there are more than 421,000 Australians living with dementia. Without a medical breakthrough, this figure is expected to increase to more than 812,500 by 2058.

Australian research indicates at their first consultation with a healthcare professional, 76% of people diagnosed with dementia had advanced beyond the early-stage and 20% were in the moderate-to-severe stages, highlighting the extent of delay in dementia diagnosis.

BrainTrack was specifically designed to address the need for earlier diagnosis of dementia.

BrainTrack encourages users to start a confidential conversation with their primary care physician about brain health, by encouraging help-seeking to enable timely diagnosis of dementia. Rather than offering a memory test, the app promotes a wellness approach by providing messaging about healthy brain ageing, risk factors associated with poor brain health, strategies to promote brain health, and links to evidence through curated library guides, and creating an individualised brain-health profile.

Using gamification and haptics, underpinned by empirical evidence of cognitive changes that occur for people with declining cognitive function, this technology aims to engage individuals who have a health or lifestyle predisposition to dementia, those who are interested in healthy ageing, and concerned they may be experiencing early changes in cognitive health.

By prompting confidential conversations with primary care physician, BrainTrack supports early diagnosis.

BrainTrack received funding from the Australian Medical Research Future Fund to conduct a large-scale study to understand BrainTrack use and its influence on help-seeking, knowledge and beliefs about dementia, to be released in 2025.

Since launching in October 2022, BrainTrack has achieved significant success, with downloads exceeding 100,000 from Australia, India, New Zealand, US and UK.

BrainTrack was launched by Ministers from the newly elected Federal Government at a Meet the Ministers Webinar initiated by Dementia Australia attracting 1685 registrations.

The media launch and marketing campaign reached more than 4 million, including Channel 7, Woman's Weekly, The Herald Sun (News Corp), ITWire, Sky News and Who Magazine.

BrainTrack achieved the target of 40,000 downloads in less than 6-months, beating the target date by 2.5-months.

In release week, BrainTrack was the number-one most downloaded education app on the Apple and Google stores

Almost 78% of BrainTrack users have participated in all eight activities, with more than 90% of those users completing each activity.

The average time of engagement within the app is 36.58min. The average number of sessions by each user was 4.2.

More than 56,000 cognition reports have been generated by more than 20,0000 users.

BrainTrack was developed by Dementia Australia with the Applied Artificial Intelligence Institute (A²I²), Deakin University and funded by the Australian Government.
